TRACKING TURTLES:

January at Pacuare Reserve is a quiet time for visitors and turtles alike. The “off-season” lends an abundance of opportunities to prepare for the arrival of the leatherback sea turtles and the research assistants protecting them, starting with the installation of location markers along the 6-kilometer beach of Pacuare Reserve.

YOUR IMPACT:

Tropical storm winds, beach erosion, and termites all degrade the location markers that are essential in tracking turtles. The success of the census depends on a well-marked beach, and the Reserve team relies on volunteers like you to make it happen.
